Raising A Village Foundation began as the vision of Jaleesa Hall, who started the college initiative Driven Student Organization on the campus of Clark Atlanta University. The Driven Student Organization launched in 2010 as a campus-chartered organization that is committed to providing college students with high standard scholastic achievement opportunities, community engagement, and leadership skills. Serving an audience of 10,000 plus college students, Driven made tremendous strides in the community by implementing monthly topical symposiums, the Truth or Dare AIDS and HIV Awareness Campaign, and the Driven 2 Succeed program at the Atlanta Children's Shelter. In 2017, Jaleesa expanded the student organization and its initiatives by establishing the Raising A Village Foundation (RAV) in Washington, D.C. RAV launched its first program, Driven 2 Succeed (D2S) in 2019.

Since that time, Raising A Village has experienced significant milestones in the areas of program expansion, fundraising, and community partnerships. The Driven 2 Succeed program has grown from three locations to eight; those sites include five DC Public Schools and three affordable housing communities in the District of Columbia and Maryland. In addition, Raising A Village's budget has tripled within the last year through paid contracts and has garnered five additional program and corporate partners.

RAV functions as a direct response to the issues that prevail in low-income areas. Raising A Village leads several key initiatives designed to create positive change for children and families in underserved communities. Each program offers support and educational opportunities that promote personal growth and civic engagement. These initiatives include: Driven 2 Succeed, Driven Student Organization, At the Table, and We the Village.



Our Program

Driven 2 Succeed (D2S) is a youth-development program for elementary, middle, and high school students that provides support in the areas of academic intervention, social emotional learning, and college and career readiness. Driven 2 Succeed's goal is to create clear pathways to productive citizenship by giving students the necessary tools to thrive in school, community, and life.

Driven Student Corps (DSC) provides the opportunity for local college students to dedicate a year of part-time service to the Driven 2 Succeed program as a high impact tutor and mentor. From kindergarten to college, Driven Student Corps Members are there to support students throughout their matriculation process and prepare them for the world beyond the classroom. The Driven Student Corps Program consists of two pathways in which applicants may enroll including Driven Student Guides (DSGs) and Driven Student Leaders (DSLs). Driven Student Guides are high-achieving college students, with varying majors, who are hired through the Public Service Federal Work Study program to lead academic interventions in community learning centers. Driven Student Leaders are junior, senior, or graduate level students, majoring in elementary and secondary education, who work alongside K-12 teachers. DSLs provide tutoring and student teaching support in math and literacy classes.

Our Model

Driven Student Corps Members serve in a diverse group with 4 to 10 other team members from local colleges and universities. Each team is led by a Raising A Village Site Lead, who spearheads training, school partnerships and also directs the team in decisions that are made concerning service delivery. DSGs and DSLs support their students through one-on-one instruction and small group work in math, literacy, and college readiness.



In-Classroom Support offers assistance to K-12 teachers in the classroom for three to four hours during the school day. Driven Student Corps Members work in math and english classes to support a designated small group of students with their classwork.

Grade Levels: 3rd, 5th, 6th, 8th, 9th, 10th Student Max: 25 students per class period

Summer Acceleration is a five day weekly program where students come to a school or community learning center to work on academics (literacy and writing), socio-emotional skills, and community service activities. RAV staff members lead each session in an effort to mitigate summer learning loss.

Grade Levels: 3rd, 5th, 6th, 8th

Student Max: 15-20 students per grade level

Lunch & Learn is our effort to support students during the lunch hour.

Students spend half of their lunch period receiving tutoring from a Driven

Student Corps Member to finish missing assignments in key subject areas.

Grade Levels: 3rd, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th

Student Max: 15-20 students per grade level

Homework Help is a service that offers tutoring for assignment completion. This after school program is structured into two-hour sessions. One hour for homework and one hour for extra-curricular enrichment.

Grade Levels: Kindergarten through 8th grade

Student Max: 15-20 students per day

Raising A Village Foundation has experienced significant milestones and key accomplishments in the areas of program expansion, fundraising, and community partnerships. Our partnerships include Communities in Schools Nation's Capital, the DC Public Schools "Connected Schools" initiative, and Enterprise Community Development. These partnerships help us bolster accelerated learning programs in schools and affordable housing communities.

Recently, Raising A Village Foundation became a Design Fellow and City Tutor DC provider with CityBridge Education to address the pandemic's impact on student achievement through access to high-impact tutoring. CityBridge Education has also provided \$60,000 in funding to help us increase our tutor corps for the upcoming school year. In order to continue our success, Raising A Village Foundation has partnered with FairChance Incorporated, a non-profit organization that supports organizations on the frontlines to fortify their sustainability, transform leaders, and strengthen their capacity to achieve life-changing results for children and youth experiencing poverty. Through the FairChance Praxis Partnership, our Founder & CEO will participate in a 12-month engagement to bolster organizational leadership and foster systems to improve sustainability and growth in four of the following areas: Board Development, Financial Management, Fundraising, Human Resources, Leadership Development, Outreach & Communications, Planning & Strategy, and/or Program Evaluation.
